

1916 - To run for reeve, the person had to have been a councillor one or more years. The RM worked with highway commissioners to develop a road system. Diphtheria was a problem. An automobile tax was implemented to fund road development. \$11,000 was received for specific road building. The RM donated monies to War and Navy League, Red Cross and the Salvation Army.

1917 - Gopher bounty – 2 cents per tail. Council meetings held on the 2nd Saturday of the month.

1918 - Adam's Leaning Wheel Grader and 12' blade was ordered. J. MacEachren operated the grader. Hillburn Telephone Co. built lines. The wolf bounty was \$1.50. Due to shortage of feed cattle were allowed to run at large fall until April 30, 1919. Hart Par tractor with 4 barrels (This was an internal combustion engine) was purchased for \$1300. RM declined union with Moosomin Hospital and wanted to look into cottage hospital for Wapella.

1919 - Eldon Irwin hired at \$100 per month to run the Adam's grader. Serum for Blackleg for 1000 head was requested. \$25 a quarter grant to public washrooms in Wapella. Taxes exempt for soldiers in the services.

1920 - Stooks in fields of Div. 5 and 6, cattle were not allowed to run at large in the fall. Council decided to decline lending RM engine out to anyone.

1921 - Silverwood rented engine and grader for \$2 per hr. Gophers still a problem. Provincial #1 Highway was in planning stages to be built. Land values \$14-\$22 per acre.

1922 - Mill rate of 7 mills. Many bridges were in bad shape.

1923 - The CPR and the Hudson Bay Company each still owned 11 quarters in the municipality. Permission was granted to destroy troublesome muskrats.

1924 - The municipality arranged to use Wapella council chambers for \$12.50 for 6 months.

1925 - School districts were reorganized to make distance from schools not an issue. Council was approached for care of the elderly by family members. St. Hubert's nursing home charge was \$31 dollars per month at that time.

1926 - The RM contacted Soldiers Settlement Lands to make valuation as favourable as possible otherwise in a short time none will be left on the land.

1927 - Council purchased brand books.

1928 - Hart Par tractor put up for sale. They decided not to buy a Caterpillar engine due to poor finances. A barrel of Acme Weed Killer was ordered.

1929 - \$318 paid to Anti-TB League for free treatment at the San for residents of Martin RM.
