#### **PAYMENT METHODS FOR TAXES & ACCOUNTS PAYABLE**

In 2014 the RM implemented **On-Line Banking** through the Royal Bank and Conexus Credit Union. On-Line Banking name is: *Martin No 122 (RM)* Please use your 4-digit account number found on your tax notice (add zeros in front to make it 4-digit).

In 2017 the RM started accepting **DEBIT CARD, MASTERCARD, and VISA**. We still accept cheques or cash!

Did you know that you may also make arrangements to pay your taxes **MONTHLY** either by Internet Banking or via Post-Dated Cheques? This option makes budgeting for your tax payment easier! Please do not hesitate to contact Cheryl to discuss.

### THIS IS THE LAW!

Section 203 (1)(c) of the *Traffic Safety* Act states: "No person shall drive a vehicle on a highway at a speed greater than 60 kilometres per hour when passing... (c) any highway equipment on a highway that has ministry issued warning lights in operation, whether in motion or not." This means gravel road and municipal equipment with flashing lights!

PLEASE SLOW DOWN TO 60KM/HR when passing and meeting RM Graders and workers.

If you are planning a controlled burn please call the number above so you are not billed for a fire call. The number is answered 24/7 - 365days a year!

If there is a FIRE BAN issued by the Municipality and you burn you will be charged with a fire call (if fire department is called out) as well as a fine. Most importantly DID YOU KNOW ...... you are NOT covered by your insurance and could be liable for any damages that occur as a result of the fire!

Fire Ban Notice is POSTED to ratepayers who have given their EMAIL address, posted on Facebook and poster in the Wapella Post Office.

### REMINDER OF YEARLY NOTIFICATION FOR USERS OF NON-POTABLE WELLS

Please be advised that the water from the Jacobi/Gillich Well (NE 01-13-33-W1); Correction Line Well (SW 02-15-33-W1) and Red Jacket Well (SE 33-14-32-W1) that is available to the public is not potable (the water is not safe for human consumption). The water from these wells is **NOT TREATED or TESTED** and is considered unsafe for human consumption. **DO NOT USE** this water for drinking, cooking, food preparation and/or oral hygiene purposes.



#### MOWING REQUEST

Mowing will soon be underway for 2019. Please remember **not to drop gates in the ditch area!** Please put the gates along the <u>inside</u> of your fence so they are visible to the mower operator – your gates will inevitably last longer!



# DEVELOPMENT PERMITS

**ALL RATEPAYERS** must contact the Administrator for a **DEVELOPMENT PERMIT APPLICATION** for any and all development(s) on their property. Development must not proceed until the Administrator has issued a **Development Permit.** The reason for the issuance of a Development Permit is to ensure that all development meets the Zoning Bylaw requirements and most importantly that the Ratepayer (you!) have not developed on a road allowance, too close to the road or property line, on environmentally sensitive land, etc. This is for your protection!

## GRAIN BAG BURNING ...... THAT'S A BIG NO NO!!!!

**It is illegal to burn grain bags** on public <u>OR</u> private property. Fines for burning grain bags range from \$0 to \$1 Million based on the severity of the offense. The most relevant restrictions related to grain bag burning can be found in *The Environmental Management and Protection Act*, 2002 under Section 4(1) and *The Clean Air Regulations* under Section 11.

# WHAT HAS THE RM OF MARTIN BEEN UP TO THIS PAST YEAR?

We only had one major project in 2018 and that was the clay capping of the Old #1 / Grid 703.

### Old #1 / Grid 703 (Township Road 152) from Moosomin Border (4 miles)

The Grid 703 (Township Road 152.1 to 152.2) was 90% completed in 2018. The final work finished up this spring. Four miles of road were clay capped along with new culverts installed. There are still some miscellaneous 2019 expenses to account for but we anticipate that we will still be under budget once those numbers are figured out.

Budget \$490,000 therefore came in <u>under budget</u> \$14,903.64	

The RM of Martin contributed \$17,000 towards the Municipal Office Renovations. The total renovations were a little over \$60,000 to complete a full main floor renovation.

## SO..... WHAT'S UP FOR 2019?

- \$5,000 into Fire Reserve (Moosomin Fire Department is purchasing a used platform truck)
- \$5,000 into Health Reserves
- \$100,000 into Special Savings Reserve
- \$150,000 into Capital Equipment Reserve
- Committed \$50,000 for the proposed Moosomin Airport Expansion. The money for this will come from our health reserve.
- Increasing the Wapella Fire Department's Grant by \$3000 to help with general equipment needs
- Repair of Grid 601 south of Wapella at Hopper's Hill fixing the soft spot by digging out and replacing clay
- Repair Grid 709 (Moosomin Kipling Road) at the beginning of our sand seal. Dug out the bad spot and replaced with clay.
- Repair Grid 601 north of Wapella soft spots by digging them out and replacing with clay.
- McEchern Bridge was removed last year and this year we are planning on replacing it with a low-level crossing later this fall as we just received approval from Department of Fisheries & Oceans and Water Security Agency.
- Creating a dugout well in the Old #1 Burrow Pit that was created during last year's road construction

# HOW ARE WE GOING TO ACCOMPLISH THIS?

As you can see from your Tax Notice there is no tax increase this year – Mill Rate remains the same! The Mill Rate is 10.25 Mills. The RM has approved a budget of \$2,048,300 in expenses and \$2,072,590 in revenue for 2019. Going forward in the next few years you can expect more road upgrading, culvert replacement and on-going bridges maintenance to extend the bridges lives.
